The name of the Society is FRASER VALLEY ABORIGINAL CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES SOCIETY

The purposes of the Society are:

To provide culturally appropriate support services and programs to Aboriginal (i.e. Status, Non-Status, On Reserve, Off Reserve, Stó:lô and other First Nations, Inuit, and Métis) children, youth and their families residing within Stó:lô territory, including: family strengthening programs, child safety, guardianship, family finding, and caregiver recruitment and support.

The Society shall achieve its purpose(s) guided by the following:

- (a) To promote the overall welfare and development and delivery of a full range of children and family programs and services to Aboriginal people located within Stó:lô So:lh Téméxw.
- (b) To work with like minded agencies within the Stó:lô territory to establish, promote and facilitate the development and delivery of a full range of children and family programs and services to Aboriginal people located within Stó:lô So:lh Téméxw.
- (c) To recognize the responsibilities of the Stó:lô in taking care of Lets'ó:lmexw in the Stó:lô So:lh Téméxw according to Stó:lô customs, practices and laws to ensure Lets'ó:lmexw abide by and recognize Stó:lô So:lh Téméxw and protocol.
- (d) To adhere to the following Guiding Principles in establishing the Society's Governance Model:
- i. The Society will act in the best interests, safety and well-being of Aboriginal children, youth and families and respect the cultural diversity of all Stakeholders;
- ii. The Society will nominate and elect Board Directors who reside and are not affiliated as an elected or self-appointed political leader in a First Nation government or an Aboriginal political organization within Stó:lô territory;
- iii. The Society will nominate and elect Board members to ensure adequate geographical representation of the four regions of So:lh Téméxw;
 - iv. The Society will select Board members using a process that is based on transparency and merit;
 - v. The Society will ensure the elders and youth are represented on the Board;
- vi. The Society will promote and maintain good governance through accountability and transparency with Stó:lô Leadership and community members.
- (e) To engage in ongoing consultations with all Aboriginal and First Nation communities served

by FVACFSS and residing within Stó:lô So:lh Téméxw to ensure that the views of the Aboriginal communities are reflected, to the extent practicable and possible, in the programs and services developed and provided by the Society.

- (f) To provide direction and guidance for the delivery of the Society's programs and services in a manner that promotes and preserves the best interests, safety and well-being of Aboriginal children, youth and families and that respects the cultural diversity of the Aboriginal communities.
- (g) To promote the development of programs and services that encourage community involvement regarding the care and protection of Aboriginal children within Stó:lô So:lh Téméxw.
- (h) To adopt and utilize dispute resolution mechanisms to resolve disputes that may arise between the members of the Society.
- (i) To do everything incidental and necessary to promote and attain the foregoing purposes.
